Dear Parents,

The holidays marked the half-way point in our school year. Signs of spring are evident and as we get ready to turn our clocks forward (one for the diary - Sunday 26th March), we can all look forward to lighter nights and a change in weather.

Music and Changes to Weekly Timetable

The Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 pupils begin their violin lessons this term. Due to the availability of the violin teachers delivering the music, lessons will take place during Friday afternoons. To accommodate this, we ask that all pupils (**Reception – Year 6**) arrive in school on **Thursdays** wearing their **Forest Schools kit** and come to school in their **PE kit** on **Fridays**.

Pupils will be encouraged to take their instruments home to practice. Please ensure they have their violins in school every Friday so that they can take part in the lesson. To ensure accountability for each instrument, you are asked to complete the relevant form and return it to school by **Friday 3rd March**.

World Book Day

On **Thursday 2nd March**, our school will celebrate World Book Day. Throughout the day, children and their teachers will engage in a range of different activities centered around reading. Children are also encouraged to arrive at school dressed as their favourite book character. As we know, this can sometimes cause unwanted stress at home – children can wear their own clothes or pajamas as an alternative. **As we are currently having our forest schools sessions on Thursday afternoons to accommodate the KS2 music lessons**, our session on the 2nd March will involve the children taking their reading books into the woods and creating a comfortable place to read (either to themselves to their friends). Depending on how elaborate your child's World Book Day costume is, you may wish to send a change of clothing. Appropriate footwear and warm, waterproof coats are a must.

World Book Day provides the perfect opportunity for our school to officially launch our new English scheme and to do this – we would like to invite you into school to share some of the changes we have made in response to our most recent Ofsted visit. The meeting will take place after school and last approximately 30 minutes - there will be opportunities for parents to ask any questions afterwards.

Sport at Stanton

8 pupils from the juniors travelled to Anthony Gell Secondary School to represent our school in the Sportshall Athletics Rural Derbyshire Finals last month. They were fantastic and finished second overall, topping the small-school leaderboard.

Swimming

Our **Year 2, 3 and 4** pupils resume their swimming lessons at Bakewell this half-term. They will also continue their lessons after the Easter holidays and throughout Summer 1 whilst the Year 6 pupils prepare for their KS2 SATs in May. There first session will be **Wednesday 1**st **March**.

Our swimming rota is full for this half-term; however, if any parents would be willing to volunteer to accompany Miss Prystupa along with the Year 2s, 3s and 4s throughout next half-term, please fill in the rota attached to the newsletter and return it to school.

Year 6 Bikeability

A reminder that Year 6 pupils will need their bikes in school on **Tuesday 14th March** or **Wednesday 15th** to enable them to complete the final stage of their Bikeability training. Their final session will take place on the road; therefore, it is vital their bikes are in working order and they bring their helmets. Pupils can wear leggings or tracksuit bottoms, and trainers on the day of their Bikeability session. Group 1 (pupils with first initials A-G) will take part on Tuesday 14th. Pupils (with first initials L-Z) will participate on Wednesday 15th.

Comic Relief

On **Friday 17**th **March**, to help raise money for Comic Relief, we will have a non-uniform day in school – pupils are asked to bring a small cash donation. Our School Parliament will help organise teambuilding activities for the pupils to take part in throughout the day.

PTFA Easter Fair

Throughout the final Friday afternoon of half-term (31st March), our PTFA will host an Easter fair in school. Pupils are encouraged to create an Easter bonnet – those that do, will be entered into the competition and stand a chance of winning a prize of £20. Cakes (if you have time to bake - please bring them), teas and coffees will be served during the event and there will be Easter-themed activities for the children (and adults) to participate in. Doors open at 1pm – the more, the merrier.

English Scheme and School Library

All school books are now banded and class teachers have conducted additional 'fluency assessments' which have helped ensure all pupils are reading books that progress their learning. The PTFA funded books have also been ordered, which we hope will provide a wider selection for our pupils to engage with. Further information, along with examples of our new English scheme, will be presented during our English Curriculum Workshop in school on Thursday 2nd March. We hope you can all attend.

Year 5 and 6 Residential

Grace has been part of the furniture at Stanton for many years and her unrivaled calmness, patience and kindness will be missed greatly by us all. Below is a message from Mrs. Young herself:

Since March 2020 I have been suffering with declining health and so it is with great sadness but fantastic and happy memories that I leave the lovely children and staff of Stanton in Peak School.

My association with Stanton School is a long one; first as a pupil in the 70's, followed by my eldest child Rosie starting at the school in 2001 and later her younger brothers, Sam and Jim.

My employment at the school began in January 2007 as Midday Supervisor and then Teaching Assistant working in both Infant and Junior classes.

I consider my time working at the school as far more than just a job, my colleagues have often become friends; friendships that have continued long after we have stopped working together. But the most important people in any school are always (and must be) the children. Over the years the Stanton children have brought me so much fun, laughter, fulfilment and pride (not to mention a few more grey hairs!)

Over the 16 years of my employment many things have changed....curriculums, policies, procedures etc, but the needs of the children don't alter. Every child needs, love, care, fun, a listening ear, stability, honesty and guidance. I hope I have been able to impart some of these attributes.

I have so many good memories but a few highlights have to be Art lessons, Forest Schools (especially fire lighting!), Nativity plays, which always made me cry (for the right reasons!), picnics on the moor, country walks, growing vegetables in the school allotment, snowball fights, Easter egg hunts.....I could go on!

From meeting nervous, shy four year olds in Reception and seeing them flourish into mature, confident, polite children with enquiring minds at age eleven has been one of the most rewarding things I have ever done.

I will continue to support Stanton school from the side-lines and whenever possible try to get in to see the children, who I miss so much.

I wish the whole Stanton family every success in the future.
