Dear parents and members of our school community,

School reopens after the holidays on **Monday June 2nd** and as we enter our final half-term of this academic year, there will be many opportunities for our school community to come together and celebrate the pupils. We are looking forward to seeing you all in and around school.

Christian Value

Throughout our final half-term, our Christian value will be 'Respect'. Mrs. Wyer will focus on the following themes during her collect worships: remembering to pray for others (Ephesians 6.18); valuing difference (Luke 7.1-10); valuing others as we would like to be valued (Matthew 7.12); valuing special places (Matthew 21.12-17); and valuing different opinions (1 Peter 2.17).

Safeguarding

At 2:55pm (slightly before the end of the school day – to avoid traffic), pupils will cycle back to Birchover alongside their teachers. Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

Year 1 phonics screening checks will take place week commencing **9th June**. All year 1 pupils will participate. The assessment can help staff to spot gaps, monitor progress and ensure children are supported effectively.

Year 4 Multiplication Check

A reminder that the Year 4 multiplication times-table check takes place this month. This is an onscreen assessment consisting of 25 multiplication questions. Pupils will have 6 seconds to answer each question with a 3 second pause between each question. This year's checks will take place between **Monday 2nd and Friday 13th June**.

Year 6 Taster Day at Lady Manners

Our Year 6 pupils, who will be beginning their journey at Lady Manners in September, have two transition days scheduled. The first on **Thursday 19th June**, and their second transition day will be on **Wednesday 2nd July**. Lady Manners should have contacted (or will be contacting) families with further details regarding these days.

In addition to the transition days, our pupils met with their Head of Year – Mrs. Hallam. During her visit to school, Mrs. Hallam provided the opportunity for the children to ask lots of questions. Hopefully her answers went some way towards putting their minds at ease. She was very impressed with how they all conducted themselves – they all made a great first impression.

Some feedback she gave regarding ways parents/school can help support transition: giving the pupils tasks to do – things to remember. Throughout our final half-term, the pupils will all be given a blue pen and asked to take it home each day and ensure they bring it back to school the following day. Get changed quickly – Mrs. Hallam mentioned that children in primary schools all arrive at school wearing their PE kits and that this has impacted some children's ability to get changed quickly after PE lessons at Lady Manners, causing them to be late for their next lesson. She suggested parents challenge their children to get changed quickly (and independently!) over the summer.

Ensuring our pupils have a smooth transition up to secondary school is important. We will be speaking with the Year 6s regularly about their transition and helping them prepare throughout their final half-term with us. One of the things we will do is make use of their 'virtual tour' which can be found on the Lady Manners website: <https://www.ladymanners.derbyshire.sch.uk/join-us/admissions/virtualtours/> - this may be something you wish to do together at home as well. If you have any concerns, or would like to chat about your child's transition, please contact school.

Carnegie Reading Project Year 6 at LMS

On **Thursday 26th June**, our Year 6s will travel to Lady Manners and take part in the Carnegie Project. The Carnegie Prize is to choose the best illustrated book of 2025. As part of the project, our school has been sent several books to engage with prior to our visit:

During the day, our pupils will work alongside children from other primary schools and Lady Manners staff, discussing their thoughts and opinions on the books they've engaged with as well as being led and supported through a range of book-focused tasks and activities. As well as supporting their progression with reading, this also presents an opportunity for our pupils to experience what it is like at secondary school – hopefully helping with transition, once that time comes.

The event takes place in the morning. We are asking that parents drop their children off at Lady Manners at 9:10am. After the event, the children will travel back to school in time for their lunch (**if any parents are available to help transport the children back to school at 11:30am – please contact the school office**). We ask that all pupils wear either their green school hoodies or green school jumpers on this day. Forest Schools will take place as normal in the afternoon.

Whole School Photo and Year 6 Leavers' Photo

Our whole school photograph is scheduled for **Monday 16th June**. Please can all pupils arrive at school wearing their full school uniform on this day. In addition to our whole school photo, the Year 6 leavers will also have a class photo on the same day – having their leavers hoodies and school jumpers in school that day is a good idea.

Sport at Stanton

There are two remaining sporting events this academic year:

- the Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 cricket skills event at Longstone Primary School on **Thursday 26th June**
- the Year 5 and 6 rounders tournament at Rowsley Sports Field on **Thursday 10th July**.

The infants will travel by coach to their event in Longstone, and the Year 5s and 6s will enjoy the short walk down to Rowsley for theirs. Please can parents complete the relevant forms (attached to the newsletter) and confirm who will be picking your child up from each event. The competitions are scheduled to finish at 3pm. We encourage car-sharing wherever possible and if you are having difficulties arranging transport, please contact the school office for support.

Inspirational Athlete

Our athlete – Joel Fearon, a Great British bobsledder and sprinter, spent the day working alongside our pupils, inspiring the next generation. As well as engaging with Joel, the children also spent time within their classes sharing information about the plethora of sports clubs they all attend and discussing ways they can keep fit and healthy.

The sport-filled day also presented opportunities for our pupils to create (and deliver) their own circuits to their peers as well as engaging with a range of different games focused around agility, balance and co-ordination.

We hope that the day inspired the children and gave them the belief that anything is possible!

Bunting Cup

Whilst the rest of the school were busy participating alongside Joel Fearon, our school football team were competing in the Bunting Cup – an annual tournament held on Cavendish Fields, Matlock. There were 15 teams competing in the small schools tournament from 14 different schools. Stanton were in group B and remained unbeaten after all six group matches, accumulating enough points to secure a place in the semi-finals.

The semi-final was a tight affair with both sides creating good chances. However, with the score still goalless after extra-time, Stanton's fate was sealed by penalties and our team narrowly missed out on a place in the final losing to eventual winners, Crich.

Nothing could separate us from Castle View Primary in the third-place play-off and once extra-time had been played, match officials made the decision for both teams to share 3rd place.

Third place in an incredibly competitive tournament is something that our team should be immensely proud of. All 12 players contributed brilliantly throughout the afternoon and were a real credit to our school. Despite feeling incredibly disappointed, they should all hold their heads up high.

Not only did the team play well, but they also looked the part in our new school kit!! Thank you, Niall, once again for your generous donation.
